

Law Society of Zimbabwe (Amendment) By-laws, 2024 (No. 16)

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IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Justice, Legal and Parliamentary Affairs, in terms of section 87 of the Legal Practitioners Act [*Chapter 27:07*], approves the following by-laws adopted by a majority of members present at a general meeting of the Law Society of Zimbabwe:—

*Title*

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Law Society of Zimbabwe (Amendment) By-laws, 2024 (No. 16).

2. The Law Society of Zimbabwe By-laws, 1982, published in Statutory Instrument 314 of 1982 (hereinafter called “the principal by-laws”), are amended in by-law 39(c) and (d) by the deletion of “chairman” and the substitution of “Secretary”.

3. The principal by-laws are amended by the insertion after by-law 40 of the following section—

*“Procedure for conduct of an electronic poll*

40A (1) As an alternative to the process prescribed in by-law 40, the Secretary may, where he or she is required to proceed in accordance with by-law 39(c), proceed to conduct an electronic poll.

(2) The polling application shall be in a form approved by the council of the Society.

(3) At least ten (10) days before an annual general meeting, the Secretary shall notify in writing or electronically, the opening of the poll, and send together with such notice the voting details and instructions to all eligible voters for the seats being contested.

(4) The polls shall be closed at twelve (12) noon on the last business day preceding the annual general meeting, in the presence of the Auditor who shall be assisted by a member of the Society appointed by the President of the Law Society of Zimbabwe and not nominated for the election.

(5) After ascertaining the poll results, the Auditor and assistant shall prepare and submit a report, and the poll results to the Secretary of the Society.

(6) The Secretary shall announce the results of the election at the annual general meeting.”.

4. The principal by-laws are amended in by-law 40(6)(a) by the deletion of “President” and the substitution of “Secretary”.

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
